

All Parish and Town Councils throughout England are required by law to hold an Annual Parish Meeting. The Annual Parish Meeting is a meeting of all the local government electors for the Parish. It is not a Meeting of the Town Council.

Members of the public (including the press) are welcome at the meeting, but the only persons entitled to speak and vote are the persons registered as local government electors for the Parish of Glastonbury.

The purpose of the meeting is so that electors can have their say on anything they consider is important to the people of the Town.

An elector may also make suggestions and comment on anything pertinent to the people of Glastonbury. This is very much welcomed and is the whole purpose of the meeting.
