

## Monthly Police Report – 13<sup>th</sup> August 2019

Please find below a brief update of some of incidents and events the Glastonbury beat team have been involved with this month. It has been a very busy month!

- I am in the process on launching a Mini Police unit at St. Benedict's school. I have spent time at the school launching the idea, received applications and conducted interviews with the children. We now have 18 year 5 children who will represent the school and Glastonbury as Mini Police officers from September. We will be looking for opportunities to get involved in community events throughout the year. Thank you to the youth council for supporting this with funding.
- PCSO Charlotte BRADLEY and I have been working with our specialised Police team 'OP TOPAZ' who specialise in Child criminal and Sexual exploitation and drug education, at St. Dunstan's school. We have completed assemblies and parents information evenings to make everyone aware of the current risks to children.
- Weekly 'Cuppa with a Copper' has been taking place in Cafes throughout the town as well as at St. Dunstan's school (until the end of term) These are proving popular with more and more members of the community coming to find us.
- PCSO BRADLEY and I assisted at Camp Avalon / Black2nature at Paddington farm, Glastonbury for a weekend. This is a charity run idea which brings deprived children from ethnic minorities to the countryside. Our role in this was to engage with the youths, who were not 'pro Police' and improve their opinions through interaction. This was a great success for us and they are hoping to find 'Officer's like us' near to their own homes!
- PCSO Nik BURGE arranged 'Police vs St. Dunstan's' football tournaments' at Tor leisure. This was very popular with two Police teams and two children's team and you will be glad to hear resulted in no injuries to the Glastonbury beat team (or the kids)!
- All members of the beat team have been out of foot seizing alcohol in the restricted drinking zone and making ourselves known to the new faces in town. We have been advised that Mendip council now have the appropriate staff in place to take legal action against those refusing to stop drinking, so PCSO BRADLEY has referred our first offender the them and we are awaiting and update on progress.
- An ASB warning letter has been issued to a male in town who has been reported to Police on a number of occasions for causing anti-social behaviour.
- A level 2 ASB warning letter was issued to a female who has been making a nuisance of herself at various locations in Glastonbury.
- PCSO BRADLEY and PCSO BURGE quickly located a male wanted on warrant despite the warrant only being issued an hour earlier, this male was arrested by PC 2299 HICKS and put before the court.
- PCSO BRADLEY and I ran a 'Youth engagement stand' at Children's world festival, Paddington farm which proved very popular.
- PC HICKS, PS PEARSON, PCSO BRADLEY and I attended Glastonbury extravaganza which went very well. There was however one male arrested for assaulting a Police officer. (No-one was seriously injured)
- PCSO LINDSELL, PCSO BURGE, PCSO BRADLEY and PC HICKS seized four vehicles after complaints from members of the public, for having no road tax.
