

## Police Report October 2019

Sorry for the delay in this report, please find below the incidents / activities that the Glastonbury Beat Team have been involved with over the past month. A lot of our time has been taken up in preparing for the Community day on Sunday 13th October.

- We have now commenced our Mini Police sessions at St. Ben's school. The first session was very popular with the pupils learning about roles of the Police and Pcsos in the Community. They have all shown interest in helping with a children's road safety stand at the Community day and I assured the uniforms will be here in time!
- PCSO Charlotte BRADLEY and I have continued our weekly visit to St. Dunstan's school to take part in cuppa with a copper.
- I have been attending Tor school weekly to engage with the students over their lunch break.
- PCSO Nik BURGE met with Elim /Connect centre to conduct day of action in the High street. This was a quieter session as the weather wasn't on our side.
- I detained a male under the MH act after he tried to cause himself harm at Wirral park. He is was assessed and released to be assisted by the outreach team in his local area.
- I took part in a multi-agency visit to a property in the centre of town after receiving a number of complaints ref disturbances at the location. There is now ongoing work with the occupants.
- The whole team took part in a training day at Mendip district council ref the PSPO. All involved parties are now a lot clearer about our requirements in the process.

As I mentioned in my last report we have now lost PC 2299 Hicks as he is working with a team out of Bridgwater Police station and PC 4151 MILLER is away on a six month attachment working with Pupil referral units and senior schools.

We are awaiting any update about a replacement and I will let you know asap.
