

Monthly Police Report – February 2020

Please find attached the engagements and commitments of the Glastonbury Neighbourhood team for the last month. It has been a busy one!

- As result of numerous reports of ASB in the Market Place, Glastonbury and the High Street, Glastonbury, as well as this being raised at the last council meeting, we have sent 10-12 requests to Mendip CCTV for footage to be checked. From this footage we have managed to identify four of the repeat offenders. All of these have now been issued with ASB warning letters. This is the beginning of a process which at its end stages can result in a Criminal behaviour order (CBO) being obtained from the court.
- In addition to this, PC Upshall and I stopped a group of 4 youths causing ASB in the Market Place last weekend. These youths have all been issued with ASB warning letters and one is being dealt with for other offences discovered by officers.
- I have been supporting St. Dunstan's school and their with some issues created by youths hanging around the school at the end of the day. (These youths do not attend the school) Two of these youths have now been identified as causing ASB and have been issued with ASB warning letters.
- I am sure that you are aware that there has been an increase in burglaries to residential properties in the local area. The team have been heavily committed in completing re-visits to the victims to offer support and crime prevention advice. We have also completed house to house enquiries to make neighbours aware of the incidents to protect their own properties. We are being supported by 'Op Remedy' officers who have already made some arrests in connection to the local incidents. We have increased patrols in the areas.
- Over the last weekend some of the local businesses in the town centre, have been the victims of attempt burglaries and one actual burglary. Again, the neighbourhood team are investigating these with the support of 'Op Remedy'.
- PCSO Paul Lindsell, PC Karen Upshall and I have taken St. Benedict's Mini Police officers on a visit to Bridgwater custody unit. As you can imagine, they were very excited but also a little wary. This gave them a really good insight into what can happen if you make poor decisions in your life. They are going to put together an assembly to pass on their experience to the rest of the school.
- PC Karen Upshall and I have completed an internet safety session at St. Benedict's school for the National internet safety day.
- PC Karen Upshall and I tracked down another male who failed to attend court and was wanted on warrant. He was arrested and delivered to the court.

On top of all of this, we have continued with our regular engagements including ASB patrols with Mendip district council enforcement officers, Beat surgeries at location throughout the town, weekly 'cuppa with a copper' in various café's, weekly sessions with the Mini Police officers amongst more.....

We are still on reduced staff numbers but hoping that this will change in the near future. PC Karen Upshall will be remaining with the Glastonbury team.
