

Good morning.

I have missed the last couple of reports due to the COVID-19 crisis and a few temporary changes in our role, but we do seem to be getting back to some normality. The Neighbourhood team have been extremely busy over the last few weeks with some of the incidents below.

- The four protests which took place in the Market Place, Glastonbury, which resulted in at least six fines being issued and two arrests. The team were assisted by support group and the mounted section.
- A business in the town has suffered three incidents of Anti-social behaviour which has resulted in us arresting a male who was charged with public order offences and will be attending court next month. He has also been issued with an Anti-social behaviour warning.
- Officers attended an address in Glastonbury where we seized a number of Cannabis plants and dealt with the owner for the offence.
- After reporting a male for breaching the PSPO (drinking when asked to stop) to Mendip District council, they issued a Fixed penalty notice. Unfortunately they were unable to issue (due to COVID restrictions) so we have supporting them in issuing this. The male has failed to pay the fine so they are currently completing a court file to progress this.
- Four ASB warning letters have been issued in the last week, for anti-social behaviour in the town centre.
- There have been two CPN's (Community protection notice) put in place ref two males behaviours in the town centre, they do seem to have calmed down since the issue of these.
- A male was hit by a car on the Paradise estate last week, he is still in hospital and in a serious but stable condition. Three persons were arrested in the vehicle involved, later that day in Dorset. Two males have now been charged with attempted murder.
- PCSO Nik BURGE and PCSO Paul Lindsell, located a male wanted on warrant and was assisted by the mounted officers in his arrest.
- PCSO Freya CLARK and I have supported NHS in an outreach / education day with the caravan communities in Glastonbury. We attended all area's known and provided hand sanitiser and education surrounding the COVID-19 crisis.
- A male was arrested for theft of alcohol and causing anti-social behaviour in Tesco Glastonbury. He was charged with these offences.
- I have continued to support the schools in conducting welfare checks on those pupils not engaging or responding to any contact with the staff.
- We have continued High visibility patrols in the town centre and surrounding areas.

We will continue to adapt to the changes as they are brought in and deal with the issues arising. We have had some slight staffing changes, PCSO Freya CLARK has joined the team to replace Charlotte Bradley, who left to train as a PC. Special Constable Lucy HARRISON has been furloughed from her regular employment so has supported the Glastonbury team in completing lots of shifts with us. PS 4901 Simon LANCEY has taken over from Darren Pearson as Sgt for Glastonbury, Street and Wells. Inspector Julie DENNY has taken over from Mark Nicholson as Neighbourhood Inspector.
