

Good evening,

Sorry for the last minute report but it has been a little chaotic. Please find below the commitments of the Glastonbury Neighbourhood team for the last few months.

- There was an unfortunate incident involving PCSO Mel Rowlands, in the Glastonbury Police post during which a male became aggressive inside the post and refused to leave. Mel was forced to call for assistance. PC Katie Moyse, SC Lucie Harrison and PCSO Paul Lindsell attended to assist. The male was located nearby and arrested for assault and emergency worker x2 and Public order. The male was charged and is due to attend court later this month. In addition, the male has been issued with a Community protection warning. As a result of this incident, concerns have been raised about public access to the post. In future the door will remain locked and we will not be allowing public access. This will not affect the work we are doing in the town.
- After a number of calls ref Anti-social behaviour in the Market place a male has been issued with a level 3 ASB warning letter. (This is the final warning prior to a Community protection warning being issued.)
- PC Katie Moyse was called to a fight in the High street. One male was arrested for assault. He has been released while the investigation continues but has bail conditions limiting his access to the town centre.
- After a window was smashed near to the town centre, response officers assisted by PC Katie Moyse and PCSO Paul Lindsell arrested a male for criminal damage and assaulting an emergency worker. He has been released under investigation.
- PC Katie Moyse and PCSO Mel Rowlands assisted NHS outreach workers in conducting a vaccine clinic to ensure that the COVID vaccine was available to all areas of the community. Although there was not a huge uptake due to individual views some positive links and feedback was gained.
- PCSO Paul Lindsell and PCSO Freya Clark assisted Somerset County council with attending all caravans, campervans and tents in the Glastonbury area to issue notices of prior warning ref the portable toilets and water bowsers being removed. This also provided notice that evictions could be re-commencing in the near future. (All evictions have temporarily been on hold due to Government guidelines).
- PS Simon LANCEY, PC Katie Moyse and PC Mark Pople attended to assist Mendip District council in serving an eviction notice to a male living on land owned by Mendip District council.
- A drugs warrant was obtained for an address in Glastonbury. PS Simon Lancey, PC Katie Moyse and PC Tom Miller were assisted by other officers in executing the warrant. The warrant had a positive outcome.
- The team have received a number of complaints from businesses and members of the community ref a female chalking on the pavements in the town centre. These incidents have been referred to Mendip District council who have issued the female with a Community protection warning.
- There have also been a number of complaints about a male busking in the town centre, who is breaching the busking agreement. This male has already been issued with a community protection warning by Mendip District council. After further complaints, the enforcement officers are gathering further evidence to progress this.
- PCSO Nik Burge was on mobile patrol when he was flagged down by members of the public who were concerned about a female screaming, who was carrying a knife. He located the female and remained with her until further units arrived to deal with her.
- PCSO Paul Lindsell, PCSO Mel Rowlands and PC Katie Moyse have been working with the mental health team in relation to a vulnerable male who had not been engaging. After an

incident in which the male forced his way into a neighbouring property he was sectioned. He is now getting the support he needs.

- PCSO Nik Burge assisted Street officers in locating a male who appeared to be having a mental health crisis. After locating this male officers attended and assist him and the male was sectioned.
- PCSO Mel Rowlands has received a number of complaints about a male putting stickers around public property in the town centre. This male has now been identified and Mendip District council will be issuing a Community Protection warning to him.
- After an increase in persons trading in the town centre PC Katie Moyse has contacted Mendip licensing officers and completed a joint visit to try and monitor / reduce the issues that this is causing. On this joint visit four persons were educated ref the rules and offered papers to apply for 'Street trading authority' - which is a monthly / yearly payment to MDC. These visits will be repeated over the next few weeks to ensure this problem is reduced.

As we continue to come gradually out of lockdown, the Neighbourhood team will start to resume our normal commitments. This will include 'Cuppa with a Copper' where you will be able to find one of the team at a café in the town centre, this will be advertised through facebook and posters locally. Anti-social behaviour patrols with Police and Mendip District council enforcement officers are due to commence asap.
