

Police report – July 2021

- The team increased High visibility patrols in the town centre due to reports of Anti-social behaviour. As a result of the evidence gathered during these patrols we have worked jointly with the Anti-social behaviour team and a number of warning letters and advice letters have been issued. (In excess of 10 this month alone)
The warning letters are recorded against each individuals name and if their behaviour continues these will be escalated to Community Protection warnings.
- As a result of ongoing issues at an address near to the town centre, two Community protection warnings have been issued.
- Funding was granted for additional officers to work in the Glastonbury town centre during the normal teams rest days, to try and reduce issues while we are not on duty.
- Multi agency work is still continuing with regards to travellers evictions in the Glastonbury area. As you will have seen on social media, Bretenoux road was cleared of caravans and other areas are now being addressed.
- PC Katie Moyse and PC Karen Upshall have assisted OP HARLEY (the investigation into the disorder in Bristol) with locating offenders.
- There has been an increase in Bikes thefts throughout Glastonbury and Street. PCSO Bradley HEFFERMAN is investigating these incidents and CCTV has been obtained. PCSO Mel ROWLANDS and PCSO Brad HEFFERMAN are arranging a number of Bike marking sessions, to try and help us get any 'found bikes' back to their rightful owners. Please remind any bike users to secure their bikes.
- There has been incidents involving damage inside the Abbey ruins, Glastonbury. Progress has been made in this investigation and we are working to identify those involved.
- There was a robbery reported to have taken place in the town centre involving two named suspects. PC Katie Moyse located and arrested one of the suspects the next day. The following day PC Katie Moyse and PC Karen Upshall located the outstanding male who was also arrested. The victim is safe and well.
- PC Katie Moyse attended an incident of anti-social behaviour and Street drinking in the town centre. One female was reported for failing to stop consuming alcohol when asked to do so by a designated officer. She has reported to Mendip District Council who will be issuing a fine for the offence.

You may be aware that the Glastonbury, Street and Wells neighbourhood teams have been affected by positive COVID cases in the team. Those isolating continued to work from home and those who had not been in contact with the officers continued to work throughout. The whole Glastonbury team are now back on the beat.
