

Police Report – August 2021

Please find attached the incidents and activities the Glastonbury Neighbourhood team over the last few weeks (not including allocated crimes and investigations and emergency calls).

- The neighbourhood policing team continues with increased high visibility patrols in the town centre which has been noticed and appreciated by the shops and community.
- The female reported for the PSPO last month has paid her fine in full and apologised.
- Multi agency work is still continuing with regards to travellers evictions in the Glastonbury area. As you will have seen on social media, Bretenoux road was cleared of caravans and other areas are now being addressed.
- PC Katie Moyse and PC Karen Upshall have assisted Somerset County council with site visits to Bridies Mound.
- PCSO Brad HEFFERMAN is continuing to investigate cycle thefts from Glastonbury.
- PC Katie Moyse and PC Karen Upshall assisted ambulance with a concern for welfare in the toilets in St. Johns Carpark.
- PCSO Mel ROWLANDS and PCSO Brad HEFFERMAN have arranged a bike marking session as part of RITS on Sunday 29th August 2021.
- PC Katie Moyse and PC Karen Upshall arrested a male in Glastonbury on warrant for failing to attend court.
- The neighbourhood policing team have issued 10 separate anti-social behaviour warning letters
- PCSO Brad HEFFERMAN and PCSO Paul LINDSELL spotted a wanted male while on high street foot patrol and PC Katie Moyse and PC Karen Upshall attended and the male was arrested.
- The CCTV in the town is now being managed Mon – Fri and this is working well as we have a good working relationship with Dan who is the operator and this is providing us with information to help aid our investigations and information gathering.
- PS Simon LANCEY, PCSO Mel ROWLANDS and PC Karen UPSHALL facilitated an on line Beat surgery/meeting for Glastonbury shop owners and traders. This was not greatly attended but those that did attend asked questions and found it useful. There are plans to hold further meetings in the future with the next one hopefully to be face to face in September.
- A Glastonbury property has been closed subject to an order from South Somerset court for a minimum of 3 months due to persistent and ongoing anti-social behaviour which has been extremely difficult for residents and business owners. This is a positive conclusion that the neighbourhood policing team have been working towards.
- This is an extremely busy time of year in the town but also for the service. PC Katie Moyse and PC Karen Upshall are covering other areas for their annual leave as well as helping out response due to operational demand.
