

Glastonbury Neighbourhood Team Report September 2021

- PC UPSHALL and PC MOYSE located a beggar in the area of the high Street. After some enquiries were made, a written warning was issued to the male to prevent him continuing to beg in Glastonbury, Street or Wells. Appropriate safeguarding was also complete.
- As a result of reports of anti-social behaviour in the town centre, four ASB warning letters have being issued to persons identified as causing issues.
- A male who has continued to cause ASB in the town centre despite being subject to a Community protection warning, has breached his conditions. He has now been issued with a Community protection notice.
- After a report from a member of public about a dog being out of control in the town centre. PSCO BURGE has made enquiries and identified the owner of the dog. He has reported the owner to Mendip District Council for the breach of public space protection order and they have issued a fine.
- PSCO LINDELL, PSCO BURGE and PSCO HEFFERMAN located a male wanted on warrant in the town centre, they managed to keep sight of him until response colleagues arrived and arrested the male.
- PSCO ROWLANDS, PC POPLER, PC UPSHALL, PSCO CAVE attended RITS Fun Day at Tor Leisure to run a beat surgery and complete Bike marking. There are still push bikes being stolen across the Glastonbury and Street areas, so regular bike marking events are being help ro help reduce this. Patrols have also been increased in the area that these bikes have been taken from.
- PS LANCEY and PC UPSHALL attended a multi- agency meeting ref the issues surrounding the Tor and how to better plan any future gatherings /events.
- The team are continuing to hold regular Beat Surgeries throughout the Town to make ourselves available to talk to as many members of the Community as possible. Future dates and locations can be found on the Mendip Police Facebook page.
- High visibility patrols have increased in the town centre to try and address on going issues surround ASB and street drinking, persons involved are being advised ref the conditions of the Public Space Protection order and numerous containers of alcohol have been disposed of on a daily basis.
