

Please find below a summary from the Glastonbury Neighbourhood teams involvements this month.

- The 'Y DON'T U' Community event took place and was big a success with really positive feedback from visitors and stall holders alike. The drugs bus was very popular and feedback suggests in excess of 130 individuals went through, with many of them trying a second time - very few actually managed to get out of the escape room. Massive thanks to all who supported this event.
- After numerous complaints ref excessive noise and anti-social behaviour around an address close to the town centre, I have conducted joint visits with Mendip officers which has resulted in a 28 day closure notice being issued. The tenants should be moving out in the next week.
- PCSO 9834 BRADLEY has worked closely with the Connect centre ref a homeless male who was new to the area. He was put back in contact with family and returned to the area for support from his family.
- PCSO 9834 BRADLEY and I have completed a restorative justice session with 5 youths involved in a minor incident of theft by finding.
- PCSO 8314 ROWLANDS has been working with the Mental Health team to support a local vulnerable lady in returning to her home in Glastonbury.
- I have completed fortnightly ASB patrols with Mendip District councils enforcement officer to continue tackling anti-social behaviour and drinking in the town centre.
- After a theft from a store in the town centre, the staff followed to try and recover the item. Fortunately I was in the right place at the right time and managed to assist in detaining the male. The items were recovered and the male was dealt with through a Community resolution process.
- PCSO 6765 BURGE spotted a male wanted on warrant in the town centre, who was arrested by our patrol colleagues and put before the courts.
- PC 3648 POPLER and our new beat officer PC 2380 UPSHALL arrested a second male in Glastonbury who was wanted on warrant this month for failing to attend court for driving offences.
- Numerous members of the team were involved in the arrest of a male who breached a 'protection from Harassment order' which was put in place to protect a vulnerable member of the community. This male was put before the courts and has a second court date later this month.
- The team have stepped up patrols around the caravans in Glastonbury after three recent fires. Fire have also attended and offered smoke alarms to any willing to accept them.
- PCSO 9834 BRADLEY, a new Special Constable SC Phillips and I attend Sea cadets for a question and answer session about the Police and the community.
- There were increased patrols around Halloween, which seemed to go relatively well and we were all involved in the remembrance day parade.

It has been a very busy month...now on to carnival season!
