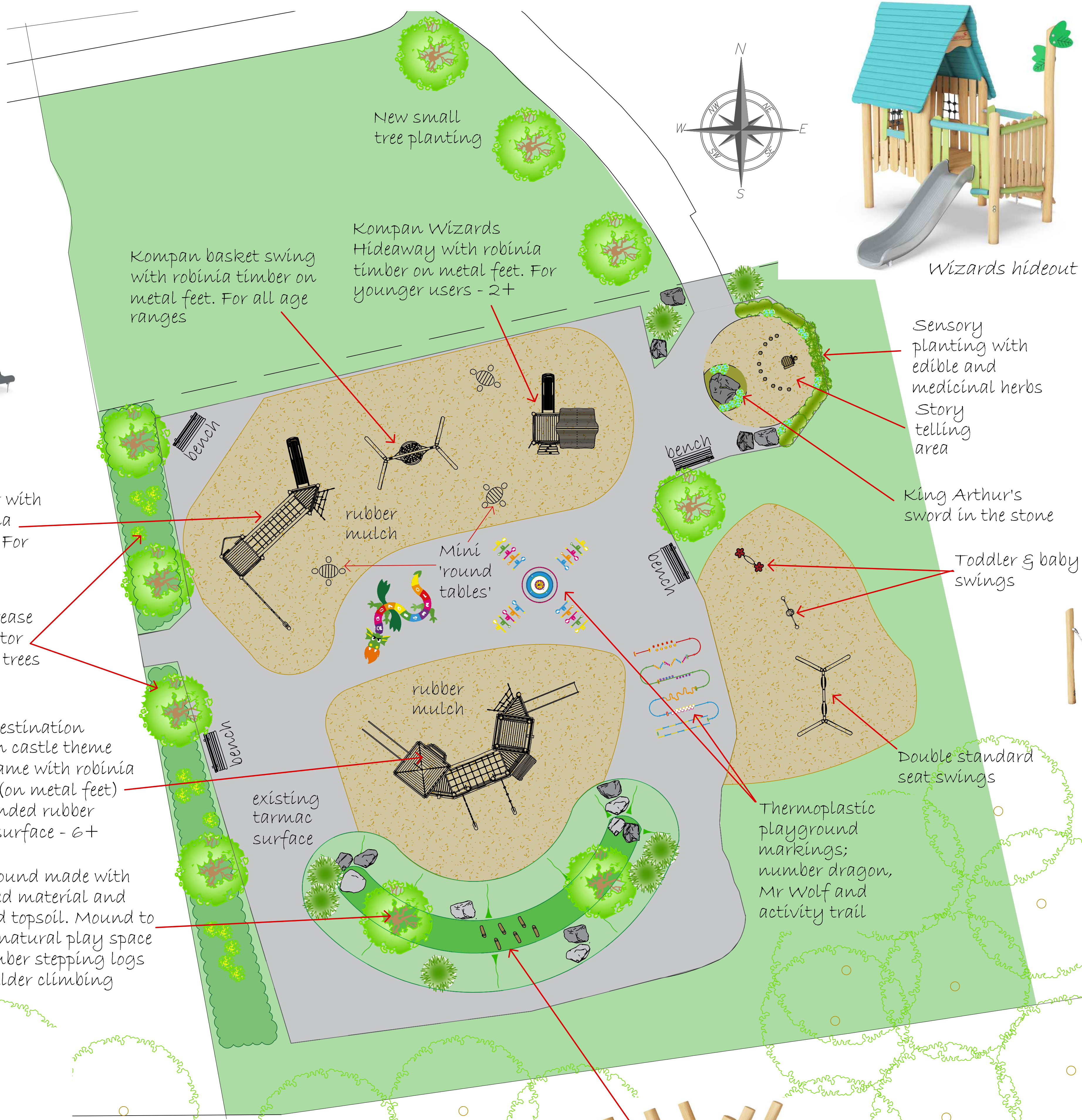

Abbey Park New Play Area - Inclusivity Statement

The new children's play area at Abbey Park, Glastonbury has been designed as an inclusive, welcoming and accessible destination where children of all ages, abilities and backgrounds can play, explore and socialise together. The design follows a "play for all" philosophy, ensuring that inclusive play opportunities are integrated throughout the space rather than being provided as separate facilities.

A range of accessible, ground-level play experiences have been incorporated to enable participation by children with varying mobility levels, including wheelchair users, younger children and those who may not be able or wish to access elevated equipment. Ground-level activities include interactive play panels, sensory features, musical elements, imaginative play opportunities and accessible social spaces, allowing children to engage with the play environment in different ways and at their own pace.

The play area includes a variety of sensory-friendly elements designed to support children with sensory processing differences, neurodiverse users and those who benefit from calmer play experiences. These features include tactile play components, natural textures, planting that provides seasonal colour and sensory interest, auditory play elements, and quiet areas where children can retreat from more active spaces when needed. The layout seeks to provide a balance between active, stimulating play and opportunities for calm engagement and relaxation.

Inclusive play opportunities are woven throughout the scheme, encouraging physical, sensory, cognitive and social development. Equipment has been selected to provide varying levels of challenge and play value, enabling children to play side-by-side and interact regardless of their individual abilities. Accessible pathways connect key play features and ensure ease of movement for all users, including wheelchair users and caregivers with pushchairs.

The design also incorporates seating, resting points and clear sightlines to support parents, carers and guardians, creating a comfortable and safe environment for families. By embedding inclusive and sensory-conscious design principles throughout the play space, the Abbey Park play area will provide meaningful play experiences for everyone, fostering confidence, social interaction, independence and a sense of belonging within the local community.
